ATISN 10014 – Correspondence relating to Dyfed-Powys Police Helicopter

Thank you for your request which I received on 4 December about correspondence relating to the Dyfed-Powys Police helicopter. The information you requested is enclosed as follows:

 All correspondence between the Welsh Government and the Police and Crime Commissioner for Dyfed-Powys, Christopher Salmon, regarding the future of the Dyfed-Powys police helicopter.

There has been no correspondence between the Welsh Government and Christopher Salmon on this issue.

• All correspondence between the Welsh Government and the UK Government Home Office regarding the future of the Dyfed-Powys police helicopter.

The Minister for Public Services wrote to the Home Secretary, Theresa May, on 23 July. The Policing Minister, Mike Penning, replied on 15 September. These letters are enclosed at docs 1 and 2.

 All correspondence between the Welsh Government and the National Police Air Service regarding the future of the Dyfed-Powys police helicopter.

The Minister for Public Services also wrote to the Accountable Manager at the NPAS, Chief Superintendent Ian Whitehouse on 23 July. We received Chief Superintendent Whitehouse's response on 3 August. These letters are enclosed at docs 3 and 4.
