Freedom of Information Request ID 10184 - Reach the Heights

Thank you for your request, which was received on 10th February 2016 with regard to funding information relating to Reach the Heights.

You asked for:

- The amount of the underspend on the Reach the Heights initiative that came from European Structural Fund (ESF) money; and,
- The amount of that underspend that was returned to the European Commission.

Please see below the information held by the Welsh Government for your request:

- The Reach the Heights initiative was originally approved for £48.9m including £26.9m of ESF in 2009. Following a pause and review of the initiative, it was re-approved at £35.8m including £19.6m ESF in 2011.
- The final expenditure for the initiative which completed in 2013 was £29.2 including £16.2m ESF funding.
- The expenditure of £16.2m of ESF money is £10.7m less than the originally approved amount.
- None of the underspend was returned to the Commission. At each stage
 where ESF funding was reduced for the Reach the Heights initiative, it was
 reinvested by the Welsh European Funding Office (WEFO) to support the
 delivery of other schemes helping young people with their skills for further
 learning and development.
