## Properties at risk of flooding from rivers and seas/surface water in Wales

Thank you for your request which I received on 22 March 2016 regarding the number of properties at fluvial, coastal and surface water flood risk from 2005 to the present day.

Welsh Government does not hold the full collection of data requested in your email. The information is derived from flood risk assessments which, for Wales, are managed by Natural Resources Wales (NRW).

The Welsh Government's flood team do have the latest risk figures which are provided to us upon request from NRW and found in associated reports on flood risk management but do not hold the detailed historic data you have requested.

As an example, I include the latest figures (below) which were provided in August 2015. We request such updates from NRW when required and I understand these figures have remained unchanged for a couple of years – the date on the table shows it as the December 2013 figures.

Further to the above, NRW's surface water risk data may not go back to 2005. This is because surface water risk was only mapped and published in its current format in 2013. The current number of properties at risk from surface water flooding is 163,000 properties.
