Request for Information – ATISN reference 10578

Thank you for your request which was received by the Welsh Government on 18 July 2016. You asked for the following information:

for each year from 2007 to 2016, how much has the Welsh Government spent on consultancy costs:

- relating to implementing the equal pay act; and
- job evaluation

There has been no expenditure on professional services in respect of implementing the equal pay act. The Welsh Government's pay system is developed in social partnership with the Trade Union Side and is subject to a collective bargaining arrangement.

The Welsh Government spent the following on professional services in respect of a significant job evaluation exercise following the mergers between the Welsh Government and a number of Sponsored Bodies on 1 April 2006. The exercise involved the independent evaluation, and moderation, of around 800 roles in the merged organisation.

2007: £335,678.23 2008: £93,987.92

There has been no expenditure on professional services in respect of job evaluation since this date. All figures exclude VAT.
