In view of the high favourability of dormice habitat in all 3 compartments I have re-assessed
In view of the condition of the existing track in compartment 3 I agree that upgrade is required to work this section safely and, due to the nature of the terrain and proximity to river Usk it would be prudent to use geotex and stone. I estimate that 100m of track upgrade from the gate should be sufficient to work the section identified for thinning/coppice in 2018.
Could you please let me know if you would be happy to progress this contract on this basis.

Many thanks for the report. Along with our observations during the site meeting this should provide sufficient information for the EPS Dormouse Licence application. I note that in Section 3.6 the whole wood has been designated as high quality habitat so this will affect the size of area we can work in section 3 where there is significant conifer.
Thanks for the email from: $NRW\ FR$ - clarification as to whether $NRW\ open$ to reasoned informed felling licence applications to work >30% of a site within a 5 year period?
It appears to me that with all being high favourability habitat then we will be restricted to 25% unless NRW SLT are willing to take a flexible approach. Whilst I'm not discounting this option my concern is that this could involve protracted discussions about mitigation etc, and with time being of the essence to get this EPS licence in and signed off before applying for felling licence. Therefore I'm inclined to draw up the licence application based on 25% over 5 years and ask whether he wants to progress on this basis.
