Complaint in respect of Request for Information – reference ATISN 10629

I wrote to you on 26 August regarding your request for an internal review. I have conducted an internal review in accordance with the procedure outlined in the <u>Welsh Government's Practical Guide for Making Requests for Information</u> which is available by post on request, or via the internet.

I note in your original request you asked what is the additional cost of producing bilingual road signs in Wales, rather than just in English? In our reply dated 26 August, we explained that we do not hold information relating to your request. We also confirmed that we do not have any comparison costs for producing signs in English only but in general that bilingual signs are more expensive as they are usually larger than their monolingual equivalent.

In your complaint dated 26 August you asked us to conduct an internal review. I have reviewed your request and have concluded that the original response provided was indeed correct.

As explained in our original reply it is a requirement that all road signs in Wales are produced bilingually and this has been the case for decades. As it is a requirement for all road signs to be produced bilingually the transport department has no need for comparison costs for monolingual signs therefore I do not consider there is any further information which could've been supplied in this instance.

It is worth noting that larger signs will be subject to greater wind loading, therefore, the size of posts and foundations will have to increase to resist the larger forces. This is

where the cost difference generally lies. Design costs would be similar for monolingual and bilingual signs.

For new road schemes, firms have to bid for the scheme and the one deemed to provide the best package when assessed against the selection criteria will be selected. The cost of sign design, manufacture and installation is included in the overall scheme cost.
