Attend the Tobacco Control Delivery Board reporting progress against actions contained within the Tobacco Control Delivery Plan and feedback views from the third sector to the delivery board and vice versa	ASH Wales attended the delivery board meeting on the 25th June 2014. Increased contribution of the 3rd sector to smoking cessation was discussed. A follow-up meeting has been arranged with the BLF and [name redacted] on July 18th to discuss taking this action forward.	ASH Wales and BLF met with Irfon Rees in July to discuss further engagement of the third sector in smoking cessation. On the back of this meeting ASH Wales is organising a Wales Tobacco or Health Network event on the 3rd Dec looking at best practice examples of the third sector being involved in the delivery of smoking cessation interventions. At the delivery board in September, ASH Wales agreed to present the illegal tobacco findings at the next delivery board in December.	ASH Wales presented the illegal tobacco enforcement problem profile at the December meeting of the Delivery Board. There was a lot of interest regarding these results and will be followed up with a report which is currently being written. ASH Wales suggested that the next meeting the delivery board focussed on the action area around young people.
