6. When was a decision made by the Welsh Government to support the progress of the plans to build a new prison at Port Talbot.

Information not held, as we have not made that decision.

9. What commitment(s) has the Welsh Government given to the Ministry of Justice regarding the siting of a new prison on the Baglan Industrial Park site.

Information not held. No commitment has been made however two licences have been granted for ecological activity and a draft copy of the Welsh Government land options agreement has been sent to the MoJ. This essentially qualifies as the start of preliminary discussions and is routine.

10. What assessment has the Welsh Government undertaken of the community & social impact upon Port Talbot.

Information not held. Welsh Government is yet to see the full proposal hence can not make an impact assessment. The Welsh Government would expect such an analysis as part of the planning application.

11. What assessment has the Welsh Government undertaken of the economic impact upon Port Talbot.

We have viewed the information provided on the HMP Berwyn website and assessed accordingly. Sam Gyimah MP, Minister for Prisons, recently announced that he would expect the facility at Port Talbot to generate up to 500 jobs and contribute £11m a year to the regional economy. The Welsh Government would expect an economic impact analysis as part of the planning application.

12. What analysis has the Welsh Government undertaken upon the financial implications for both public & community services in Port Talbot.

Information not held. These discussions have yet to take place but we would expect a similar model to be adopted as per HMP Berwyn.

13. What financial discussions have taken place between the Welsh Government and the Ministry of Justice.

Information not held. No financial discussions have taken place.

14. What criteria and/or conditions has the Welsh Government developed for the sale & development of the land at the Baglan Industrial Park site.

Information not held however, the Welsh Government has a land sale protocol that is followed when it sells land to other public organisations.
