## Request for Information – ATISN 11469

I wrote to you on 13 September following your e-mail of complaint of 8 September which we received on 11 September, 2017.

I have conducted an internal review of your request in accordance with the procedure outlined in the <u>Welsh Government's Practical Guide for Making Requests for</u>
Information which is available by post on request, or via the internet.

I note that you submitted a request for information on 10 August in which you asked when the 'problem part' of the A55 was built and when the M4 missing link was put into use compared with the A55. Your request was acknowledged on 15 August. As the Welsh Government did not understand what you meant by 'problem part' of the A55, you were asked to clarify to which section of the A55 you were referring. In your response of 15 August you commented 'I do not know which area it is because it was a passing comment in a meeting with transport staff'.

Under section 1(3) of the Freedom of Information Act, a public authority is not obliged to comply with a request for information where it:

(a) reasonably requires further information in order to identify and locate the information requested, and

(b) has informed the applicant of that requirement.

In our response of 8 September, given you had been unable to provide any further information or clarification on which part of the A55 you were referring to, you were not provided with a response to that part of your request as we were unable to identify the information you were seeking. You were advised that the M4 missing link was fully operational in 1994.

I have reviewed your request, your subsequent e-mail correspondence and the response you received. I am satisfied that given you were unable to provide any further clarification about what information you wanted us to search for in relation to the A55, the response you received on 8 September is correct.

To conclude, I do not uphold your complaint and I trust the above provides a clearer explanation of our position on this matter.
