Thank you for your request which I received on 12 October. You asked whether Glasdir, Llanrwst had been sold and requested the following details:

- who it has been sold to
- why it has been sold
- what its future use will be
- who the seller was – was it CCBC, Welsh Government, Llanrwst Council or another body; and
- how much it was sold for and any conditions attached to the sale?

The Welsh Government awarded Conwy County Borough Council a total of £1,16m of EU funds through the Objective One programme 2000–2006 to construct a facility for the provision and co-ordination of a range of business support, training providers and information sources for the rural community.

The development was completed by Conwy County Borough Council in 2008 in line with the award of funding for the construction of the facility and the durability period for the project has ended.

The Welsh Government is not currently, and has never previously been, responsible for the Glasdir facility. Therefore we do not hold any information in respect of any sale of Glasdir and have not been involved in any discussions relating to it.

If you are dissatisfied with the Welsh Government's handling of your request, you can ask for an internal review within 40 working days of the date of this response. Requests for an internal review should be addressed to the Welsh Government's Freedom of Information Officer at:
