ATISN-11943: Request for Information

Thank you for your request which we received on 24 January 2018 for information regarding care homes in Wales.

You asked for:

- Details of care homes which are currently listed as a service of concern with CSSIW.
- Details should include the care home name, reason why they are listed, how long they have been on the list, the local authority in which the care home is located, the number of residents, and service type (older or younger).
- If possible, please also confirm whether there are any residents receiving local authority funding for their residency and how much each care home receives from the local authority.

Please note that as of 15 January 2018, Care & Social Service Inspectorate Wales (CSSIW) changed name to Care Inspectorate Wales (CIW).

The information that you have requested in the first two points above is enclosed at Annex 1.

CIW does not collect or hold information regarding care home resident's funding so we are unable to provide you with the information requested in your third point above.

If you are dissatisfied with the Welsh Government's handling of your request, you can ask for an internal review within 40 working days of the date of this response. Requests for an internal review should be addressed to the Welsh Government's Freedom of Information Officer at:

This information was correct as at 19/02/2018 in order to provide the most up to date information, however, the situation with services that are listed as a service of concern does change frequently.

*CIW does not hold information regarding current occupancy in care homes. Therefore the figure provided in the Maximum Capacity column is the maximum occupancy that the service is registered for, not necessarily the number currently residing there.

Services of Concern are those services where CIW has decided to pursue formal enforcement action; e.g. cancel a service's registration, impose conditions or pursue a criminal investigation. Typically these are services where there are serious concerns about

the impact on the well being and safety of people using the service and there has either been a failure to improve over time or a need to take urgent action.

- The number of Services of Concern is low at the present time (around 1% of care homes in Wales) and has been falling over time as CIW has systematically tackled poorly performing care services. The number suggests that the level of serious risk to people within the care home sector is low. It cannot however be read as an indication of quality.
- Our previous analyses suggest that half of Services of Concern improve as a result of
 enforcement action, the other half are sold to new providers or are closed. Most
 Services of Concern are resolved in a matter of months, some become delayed
 through protracted legal proceedings. CIW actively considers cancelling the
 registration of any service of concern after 12 months.
- The 2016 Act which comes into force in April 2018 strengthens CIW's powers and the
 accountability of providers. Services of Concern will still be identified and are likely to
 be subject to the new Service Improvement Notices which have been created under
 the Act.
- Services of Concern will be challenged to become re registered under the new Act as they will need to demonstrate they can comply with the new regulations.
