IDENTIFICATION OF THE ANNUAL IMPLEMENTATION REPORT

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2. OVERVIEW OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE OPERATIONAL PROGRAMME (ARTICLE 50(2) AND 111(3)(A) OF REGULATION (EU) NO 1303/2013)

2.1. Key information on the implementation of the operational programme for the year concerned, including on financial instruments, with relation to the financial and indicator data.

Note: this report concerns performance in 2020 but has been prepared as the Covid-19 pandemic continues to unfold. Therefore, comments about forecast performance must be considered in the context of the impacts of that pandemic which are ongoing and likely to be significant. WEFO is planning an independent review of indicator performance during 2021 to inform future delivery.

Despite the pandemic implementation of this Programme continued to make progress in 2020. By the end of December 2020, approvals issued by the Managing Authority amounted to a total commitment of €482m of eligible costs, supported by just under €172m of EU Grant. At the revised planning rate of €1.10/£1 this meant that around 84% of the EU funds available under the Programme had been committed. The Managing Authority remained on track to achieve full commitment of the Programme with options including further commitment to successful operations.

Eligible expenditure declared to the Managing Authority by beneficiaries by December was €302m, some 73% of the programme total, and funds paid out by WEFO to beneficiaries totalled €88m.

The number of approved operations by the end of December 2020 was 44. Priorities were characterised by well-developed portfolios of operations selected to be complementary and reinforcing of each other. The Priority portfolios consisted of a blend of strategic national-level and regional-level interventions, as well as a range of more localised or target group-specific operations meeting particular needs.

The labour market was subject to a significant shock as the pandemic hit. The implications of this were complex as the threat of mass redundancies was balanced to some extent by significant interventions in the labour market by the UK and Welsh governments such as the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme. There were clear negative impacts on market indicators such as job vacancies and significant concerns about the disproportional impact on youth. However, despite the challenges of delivering during the pandemic the ESF portfolio remained very relevant to the challenges being faced.

The Welsh policy context for the new public services Priority 5 continued to develop during the year, with regions continuing their work on growth initiatives, publication of an OECD report on multi-level governance in Wales and progress on the legislative proposals for local government collaboration. A new Framework for Regional Investment in Wales was also published in November.

By December 2020, operations had reported engaging with over 72,000 participants and of these over 32,000 had gained a qualification, over 6,000 had been supported into employment or self-employment and over 2,000 young people moved into education or training.

In response to the EU's Coronavirus Response Investment Initiative (CRII), a Programme Modification was submitted to the European Commission in December 2020 to reallocate €41,000,000 of ESF from Priorities 1, 2, 3 and 5 into a new Priority Axis 6 entitled 'Containing Covid through Capacity.' The modification proposals also included some downward adjustments to indicators and targets, consequential of the reallocation of funds to the new Priority Axis.

All 2020 N+3 targets were met, as well as those for 2021.

The Managing Authority remained compliant with E-cohesion requirements. Electronic transfer of data between beneficiaries and the Managing Authority was supported by the externally facing system known as WEFO Online, used by beneficiaries to enter data, including everything from appraisal documentation to transaction lists and claims. This system links to the IT system used by Managing Authority and Certifying Authority Officials to manage structural funds, which is known as PPIMS.

3. IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PRIORITY AXIS (ARTICLE 50(2) OF REGULATION (EU) NO 1303/2013)

3.1. Overview of the implementation

		No new operations were approved in 2020 although some additional ESF was awarded to expand delivery in one established operation. Additionally, a number of projects in the voluntary sector received ESF as a result of a specific call, designed in response to the Covid-19 crisis. The WCVA led Active Inclusion scheme introduced greater flexibility to allow projects to deliver crisis alleviation measures in relation to social inclusion and employability.
		Even though the Priority is not yet fully committed, approved operations plan to support over 24,000 participants by the end of the programme period, 150% of the Operational Programme target. At the end of 2020, over 11,0000 people had been supported, being 72% of the Programme final target for 2023.
		Result indicators are strong in relation to helping economically inactive participants enter employment, exceeding the Programme benchmark target of 20%. Other indicators of enhanced employability (qualifications, job search, work experience or volunteering) are below target but expected to improve as increased numbers of participants exit their support and results are reported.
		Support to those who are long-term unemployed is making good progress, with 20% of participants supported entering employment or self-employment immediately upon leaving and operations forecasting higher levels in 2021.
2	Skills for Growth	By the end of 2020, 92% of the EU funds available had been committed to 15 operations.
		No new operations were approved in 2020, although a number of operations in this Priority were awarded some additional ESF as a result of temporary flexibility introduced by the Managing Authority due to the economic impact of the pandemic. Under this flexibility, operations could opt to relax their arrangements for employers to contribute in cash towards the cost of training for their employees, this helped ensure that those employees were not disadvantaged by the challenging economic environment.
		Progress continued to be made against the indicator targets, with some 40,000 participants already assisted by approved operations under this Priority. Participants on training at Level 3 and above (SO2) outnumbered those on foundation and intermediate level courses (SO1), which appears indicative of rising skills needs in the workplace. Female participants

		outnumbered males, particularly in the category of participants with an upper secondary education where the final programme target for females has already been exceeded.
		Approved operations have plans to assist over 61,000 participants by the end of the Programme. This is sufficient to meet most of the Operational Programme targets, but will need to be monitored as the impacts of the pandemic play out.
		Qualification results remain encouraging, with the numbers of participants gaining qualifications making good progress towards the proportions required by the Programme in most areas of the Priority. Progress against enterprises targets in SO3 remained good and the proportion of enterprises adopting or improving equality and diversity practices remained above the programme target.
3	Youth Employment	At the end of 2020, 90% of the EU allocation had been committed to 12 operations.
		No new operations were approved during the year but additional funding was approved to expand delivery in some established projects and a number of projects in the voluntary sector also received ESF as a result of a specific call, designed in response to the Covid-19 crisis. The WCVA led Active Inclusion scheme introduced greater flexibility to allow projects to deliver crisis alleviation measures in relation to social inclusion and employability.
		Approved operations have plans to support over 39,000 participants by the end of the programme period, 100% of the Operational Programme target. At the end of 2020, over 19,000 people had been supported, 50% of the final target. Interventions to address youth unemployment are particularly robust, already achieving 60% of the final output target for number of NEET participants.
		Immediate result indicators are positive in relation to helping NEET participants. 28% of NEET participants immediately moved into employment or self-employment and a further 12% entered education or training. 30% of NEET participants gained qualifications. These qualification results for NEET participants remain above the benchmark targets set as programme targets. There is expected to be increased demand for youth services as a result of the pandemic but the labour market is likely to be very challenging for youth and this may have an effect on employment results.
		Support has been delivered to over 6,000 young people at risk of becoming NEET, with positive result indicators reported for 40% of those assisted (reduced risk of NEET, including committing to new courses of education or training).

		Approved operations plan to develop and disseminate 11 new methods, procedures and tools, 138% of the Programme target.
		Circular Economy Innovation Communities, led by Swansea University in partnership with Cardiff Metropolitan University, aims to develop new regional service solutions using circular economy principles. The North Wales Regional Growth Vision Enabler, led by Gwynedd County Council, aims to establish a Portfolio Management Office to facilitate regional collaborative working in North Wales. InFuSe, led by Monmouthshire County Council, will support local authorities in the Cardiff Capital Region to build innovation capacity and tackle challenges in society.
		One further operation was in development representing the remaining sub-region of Wales, led by local government and focussed on economic development. If this is approved the overall portfolio will be in a good position to deliver its aims.

4. SYNTHESIS OF THE EVALUATIONS

Synthesis of the findings of all evaluations of the programme that have become available during the previous financial year, with reference of name and reference period of the evaluation reports used

The final report of the Evaluation of Apprenticeships Programme was published in February 2021.

The report sets out the findings covering Apprenticeships funded by the European Social Fund taking place between January 2015 and March 2019. This evaluation report summarises how the programme performed in practice, how well learners, providers, employers and stakeholders think it has been delivered, and the impact it has had on them.

Key Findings:

Programme design:

- The process for commissioning was generally seen as fair, robust and transparent, although lengthy and resource-intensive
- Many employers were in favour of apprentices leading to an accredited qualification
- Learners generally felt the structure and duration of the Programme suited their needs
- Employers were generally satisfied with the range of subjects and levels available and with the content of frameworks
- Most employers felt the move towards STEM subjects would be beneficial for the Welsh economy
- For employers, those with Welsh-speaking customers were most interested in Welsh-medium and bilingual apprenticeships. However, awareness of Welsh-medium qualifications was limited amongst employers.
- Stakeholders generally felt that the Apprenticeships levy had increased the demand for apprenticeships from employers

Programme Delivery and Implementation:

- Relationships and communication between organisations involved in apprenticeship delivery were viewed positively.
- Getting employers initially engaged with the Programme was a challenge, but employer-provider relationships were typically strong during the Programme
- Providers felt that Welsh Government should be doing more to promote apprenticeships to all audiences, and stakeholders felt Welsh Government should strengthen its relationships with employers.
- 72% of employers, and 88% of apprentices were satisfied with their provider. 85% of apprentices were satisfied with their employer.
- Stakeholder and Welsh Government officials reported inconsistencies across some areas of provision, including quality of teaching and employer engagement
- Most employers (86%) felt it was likely they would continue to provide apprenticeships in the future, 64% said they would likely increase the number of apprenticeships they provide. Over a

- quarter of training providers said they had encountered barriers in achieving gender equality (27%), recruiting more apprentices with disabilities or learning difficulties (12%) or from ethnic minorities (14%)
- More than half of employers (56%) reported that they had an imbalance by gender among apprentices. Usually they felt this was due to the nature of the sector/industry (49%)
- Female participation is particularly weak in STEM and Construction sector apprenticeships. Male participation is weak in Retail and Education sector apprenticeships, and at Higher levels.
- Many training providers (66%) had encountered barriers to delivering apprenticeships through the medium of Welsh or bilingually, usually attributed to a shortage of Welsh speaking staff (60%).
- Targets for younger learners were missed by large margins; however, this is largely due to the introduction of all-age Apprenticeships, which was not anticipated at the time targets were set. The absolute number of learners aged 19 to 24 has been in decline since 2015, and the number aged under 19 has increased by 9%

Programme Impacts: Apprentices

- Most apprentices surveyed were positive about the improvement to their situation, for example in terms of improved confidence in their abilities (85%), and improved career progression (76%)
- The Cost Benefit Analysis (CBA) indicated a strong benefit to cost ratio for the Programme relative to non-apprenticeship provision (the 'counterfactual'), even on a very short (two year) time horizon. There were several time horizons used in this analysis, the two year time horizon is the most conservative option in line with the period for which impacts could be modelled. However it is difficult to know exactly how long the impacts of the Apprenticeship Programme might last, a five-year time horizon, based on existing research, would appear a reasonable assumption.
- The impacts of the Programme according to this analysis included a 29 percentage point increase in the job entry rate relative to other provision, and, in the first year after completion, an increase of 119 days in employment and £7,866 in earnings

Programme Impacts: Employers

- For employers, the ability to shape apprentices to meet changing business needs and address skills gaps were the most positive impacts of the Programme
- If the Apprenticeship Programme did not exist, most employers felt they would be able to find alternative ways to recruit and train current and prospective employees, although none of those interviewed in the qualitative discussions believed this would be a better option

Programme Impacts: Skills

- Most apprentices (82%) stated they had acquired job-specific skills as a result of their course
- The Programme was felt to have a positive impact on the wider Welsh economy, in terms of raising the skills levels of people who have low or no skills and increasing the number of people in the workforce who have job-specific skills

The final report of the *Out of Work Service Evaluation* was published in July 2020.

The evaluation aimed to assess the delivery, performance and perceived impact of the Out of Work Service (OoWS) which began in August 2016. The final report updates and advances the findings and recommendations presented at the interim stage, and provides:

- Further insight into project delivery to date, including the experience and perspective of participants, peer mentors and delivery staff, to inform future service delivery;
- An assessment of programme progress and performance to end of October 2019;
- Insights into the outcomes, perceived impact and legacy of the OoWS; and
- Lessons for future development and commissioning.

Key Findings:

Both the interim and final fieldwork confirmed that the service is unique in Wales, filling an important gap in provision for some of those furthest from the labour market. Though most of the employment and training support offer is fairly similar to that offered elsewhere, the ability for the service to respond quickly and tailor support to a participant's needs or goals has been commended by many external stakeholders. Additionally, unlike other employability provision, the OoWS is led by peer mentors who draw on their own lived experience to inspire participants and provide tailored support for them to achieve their goals. Where there have been challenges to service delivery and meeting targets, providers have mostly dealt with these effectively, for example by increasing the number/range of voluntary placements to provide work experience in response to problems organising work placements. Participants reported being highly satisfied with their experiences and the benefits resulting, particularly in terms of how responsive and tailored the support offer was and the quality of the peer mentoring. Participants highlighted a range of perceived outcomes and impacts achieved, 7 with many citing how different their life would be without the service. While the limited number of interviews with participants did not allow insights into the consistency of provision in each area, discussions with referral and delivery partners confirmed that participants have a very positive experience with the OoWS.

(a) Issues which affect the performance of the programme and the measures taken

The Covid-19 pandemic has had a significant impact on operations from March 2020 onwards. Much delivery of face to face activities with participants has had to be curtailed, although many operations have increasingly found ways to deliver activities remotely/online instead. The Managing Authority has worked closely with the European Commission, stakeholders and operations to provide flexibility where appropriate and support operations to adapt to the circumstances.

The labour market was also subject to a significant shock as the pandemic hit. The implications of this were complex as the threat of mass redundancies was balanced to some extent by significant interventions in the labour market by the UK and Welsh governments such as the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme. There were clear negative impacts on market indicators such as job vacancies and significant concerns about the disproportional impact on youth. However, despite this the ESF portfolio remained very relevant to the challenges being faced.

Despite the pandemic delivery remains strong in a number of areas, as this report demonstrates. It is still too early to judge the full impact of the pandemic on participant numbers and outcomes. The Managing Authority is planning an independent review of indicator performance during 2021 to inform future delivery.

In December 2020, and in response to the EU's Coronavirus Response Investment Initiative (CRII), the Managing Authority submitted a Programme Modification proposal to the European Commission to introduce a new Priority Axis entitled 'Containing Covid through Capacity.' The proposed new Priority (Priority 6) will focus on widening access to health and social care to respond to the imminent need to contain Covid-19. The proposed amendments included the reallocation of €41,000,000 of funding in total from Priority 1, Priority 2, Priority 3 and Priority 5. Some downward adjustments to indicators and targets were also proposed, consequential of the reallocation of funds to the new Priority Axis, although the focus on results is maintained. The modification proposal assumes that existing employment, skills and public services activities across the ESF programme will continue to be delivered broadly in line with approved Business Plans.
