**ATISN 16356 Humanitarian Aid to Ukraine**

Thank you for your request which I received on 25/05/2022.

You asked for the following information:

- The total number of Ukrainian refugees who have moved to Wales since the 18<sup>th</sup> March 2022 is, and how many had moved from sponsored homes to temporary accommodation. You also asked how many were under 18 at the time of arrival.
- Whether the Welsh Government has received or expects to receive any funding from the United Nations for providing homes to Ukrainian Refugees.
- Whether the Welsh Government has received or expects to receive any funding from other organisations for providing homes to Ukrainian Refugees.

The information you requested is as follows:

1. 2,979 Ukrainian refugees have arrived in the UK with a sponsor in Wales since the 18<sup>th</sup> March 2022. This figure is taken from the latest public data from the UK Government which is available in the link below:

  - You asked how many Ukrainians who have moved to Wales since the 18<sup>th</sup> March have since moved from their allocated sponsored home into temporary accommodation. We do not collect this information.
  - Around a third (34%) of those who have arrived are under 18.
2. The Welsh Government has not received any funding for the Homes for Ukraine scheme from the United Nations, nor do we expect to do so.
3. The Welsh Government has not received any funding from the UK Government for the Homes for Ukraine scheme, but we expect to do so in the future. The UK Government has set out the funding which will be made available to those sponsoring Homes for Ukraine applicants. As a Super Sponsor, the Welsh Government expects to receive the full £10,500 per person plus education funding (where relevant). All of this funding will be used to provide public services for those arriving under the Super Sponsor scheme.

If you are dissatisfied with the Welsh Government's handling of your request, you can ask for an internal review within 40 working days of the date of this response. Requests for an internal review should be addressed to the Welsh Government's Freedom of Information Officer at:
