Award of Funding in relation to Sustrans Cymru E- Bike and E-Cargo Bike Pilot – Financial Years 2020-23

1. Award of Funding

- (b) The Funding relates to the period 1st February 2021 to 31st March 2023 and must be claimed in full by 30th April 2023 otherwise any unclaimed part of the Funding will cease to be available to you.

2. Statutory authority

- (d) You must not use any part of the Funding for: (1) party political purposes; (2) the promotion of particular secular, religious or political views; (3) gambling; (4) pornography; (5) offering sexual services; (6) purchasing capital equipment (other than as specified in the Purposes); (7) your legal fees in relation to this letter; (8) Costs Incurred or costs incurred and defrayed by you in the delivery of the Purposes prior to the period referred to in Condition 1 (b); (9) any kind of illegal activities; or (10) any other kind of activity which in our opinion could bring us into disrepute.

5. Funding pre-conditions

- (b) Where you are required to provide information and documentation to us as evidence that you have satisfied a particular pre-condition, Condition or in support of a claim, the information and documentation must be in all respects acceptable to us. We reserve the right to reject any information and documentation which is for any reason not acceptable to us.

6. How to claim the Funding

- (a) You may claim the Funding quarterly in arrears based on Costs Incurred and defrayed by you in the delivery of the Purposes as detailed in the Payment Profile.
- (b) You must claim the Funding in accordance with the dates set out in the Payment Profile. You must claim the Funding promptly. We reserve the right to withdraw any part of the Funding that you do not claim promptly.
- (c) You must submit your claims for payment of Funding to the Welsh Government Official.
- (d) You must use our current claim form (which is available from the Welsh Government Official) and set out in the Guidance Note and attach the information and documentation specified in the Payment Profile.
 - i) confirmation that you are operating in all respects in accordance with your constitution; and
 - confirmation that you have appropriate financial, risk and control systems in place before utilising any part of the Funding to provide a grant to or procure any goods or services from third parties;
 - iii) A progress report detailing progress made in achieving the set objectives, as detailed in schedule 1 (the Purposes); and
 - iv) A breakdown of how the money was spent
- (e) We will aim to pay all valid claims as soon as possible and typically within 28 days.

7. Your general obligations to us

You must:

- (a) safeguard the Funding against fraud generally and, in particular, fraud on the part of your Personnel and notify us immediately if you have reason to suspect that any fraud within your organisation has occurred or is occurring or is likely to occur whether or not it relates to the Funding. You must also participate in such fraud prevention initiatives as we may require from time to time;

9. Notification Events and their consequences

- (a) You must notify us immediately if a Notification Event has occurred or is likely to occur but we also reserve the right to notify you where we believe a Notification Event has occurred or is likely to occur.
- (b) We will either (i) notify you that we consider the Notification Event is not capable of remedy or (ii) if we consider the Notification Event is capable of being remedied seek to discuss the Notification Event with you with a view to agreeing a course of action to be taken to address the Notification Event.
- (c) We will be entitled to take any of the actions listed in Condition 9(d) if:
 - (i) despite our reasonable efforts we have been unable to discuss the Notification Event with you; or
 - (ii) we notify you that the Notification Event is not capable of remedy; or

- (iii) a course of action to address the Notification Event is not agreed with you; or
- (iv) a course of action to address the Notification Event is agreed with you but you fail to follow it, or any conditions attached to it are not met (including without limitation the timescale for such course of action); or
- (v) the course of action fails to remedy the Notification Event to our satisfaction.
- (d) If any of the circumstances set out in Condition 9(c) occurs we may by notice to you:
 - (i) withdraw the award of Funding; and/or
 - (ii) require you to repay all or part of the Funding; and/or
 - (iii) suspend or cease all further payment of Funding; and/or
 - (iv) make all further payments of Funding subject to such conditions as we may specify; and/or
 - (v) deduct all amounts owed to us under the Conditions from any other funding that we have awarded or may award to you; and/or
 - (vi) exercise any other rights against you which we may have in respect of the Funding.
- (e) All repayments of Funding must be made to us within 28 days of the date of our demand.

10. Monitoring requirements

You must:

- (a) provide us with such documents, information and reports which we may reasonably require from time to time in order for us to monitor your compliance with the Conditions including without limit:
 - i) Quarterly update reports on progress no later than 1 month after the end of each financial quarter and annual reports no later than 2 months after the end of the financial year detailing the achievements made in line with the agreed objectives. Failure to do so will affect any future grant agreements.
- (b) Meet with the Welsh Government Official and such other of our representatives as we may from time to time reasonably require;
- (c) Ensure that the Project Manager (or such other person as we may agree) together with any other person we may require attends all meetings with the Welsh Government Official.
- (d) Provide us with data on capital scheme(s) outcomes achieved on an annual basis for a period of 3 years following the completion of the scheme(s).

11. Audit Requirements

- (a) You must:
 - maintain complete, accurate and valid accounting records identifying all income and expenditure in relation to the Purposes;
 - without charge, permit any officer or officers of the Welsh (ii) Government, Wales Audit Office or any UK subsidy enforcement body at any reasonable time and on reasonable notice (in exceptional circumstances, such as the prevention or detection of fraud, it may not be practicable to provide you with reasonable notice) being given to you to visit your premises and/or to inspect any of your activities and/or to examine and take copies of your books of account and such other documents or records howsoever stored as in such officer's reasonable view may relate in any way to your use of the Funding. This undertaking is without prejudice and subject to any other statutory rights and powers exercisable by the Welsh Government, Wales Audit Office or any UK subsidy enforcement body or any officer, servant or agent of any of the above;
 - (iii) retain this letter and all original documents relating to the Funding until we inform you in writing that it is safe to destroy them;
- (b) Under paragraph 17 of Schedule 8 to the Government of Wales Act 2006 the Auditor General for Wales has extensive rights of access to documents and information relating to monies provided by the Welsh Government. They and their officials have the power to require relevant persons who control or hold documents to give any assistance, information and explanation that they may require; and to require those persons to attend before them for such a purpose. The Auditor General and their staff may exercise this right at all reasonable times.

12. Capital Grant Related Provisions

- Our prior approval must be sought before any change of use for assets which have been funded in whole or in part under this agreement.
- b) You shall not raise a mortgage or other charge on assets purchased under the grant scheme(s) without obtaining our prior approval.
- c) Where an asset, or an interest in an asset funded under this agreement is subsequently dispose of or ceases to be used for the

approved purpose of which it was obtained, you shall notify us. If we the so demand, you will repay to us the full market value of the asset at the date of the disposal or cessation of approved use, or such lesser the sum as we in our absolute discretion may deem to be a fair proportion of the market value.

- d) We reserve the right to take possession of all assets funded in whole or in part under this agreement at its termination. We will pay an appropriate amount, as agreed with you, should we exercise our discretion in respect of assets only partly required from grant funding.
- e) Agreement shall be sought from us before any publicly funded asset is sued to generate income.

13. Third party obligations

- (a) Nothing in the Conditions imposes any liability on us in respect of any liability incurred by you to any third party (including, without limit, employees and contractors).
- (b) You must indemnify us against any liabilities, claims, proceedings, demands, losses, costs and expenses suffered or incurred by us directly or indirectly arising as a result of or in connection with any failure by you to perform fully or in part any obligation you may have to a third party.

14. Intellectual property rights and publicity

- (d) You agree that from the date of this letter until 5 years from the date of the final payment of Funding we may include details about your organisation and business, the Funding and the Purposes in Welsh Government promotional materials and you further agree to cooperate with our reasonable requests to achieve the production of such materials.

15. Information

- (a) You acknowledge that we are subject to the requirements of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the "FOIA"), the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (the "EIR"), the Data Protection Act 2018 (the "DPA") and the retained EU law version of the General Data Protection Regulation ((EU) 2016/679) (the "UK GDPR").
- (b) You acknowledge that we are responsible for determining in our absolute discretion whether:
 - to disclose any information which we have obtained under or in connection with the Funding to the extent that we are required to disclose such information to a person making a disclosure request under the FOIA or the EIR; and/or
 - (ii) any information is exempt from disclosure under the FOIA or the EIR.
- (c) You acknowledge that we may share any data you provide to us with fraud prevention agencies and third parties for the purposes of preventing and detecting fraud. Any personal data we collect will be managed in accordance with our Privacy Notice which is available to view here http://beta.gov.wales/privacy-notice-welsh-government-grants

16. Buying goods and services

18. Equal opportunities

19. Welsh language

- (a) Where the Purposes include or relate to the provision of services in Wales they must be provided in Welsh and English unless it would be unreasonable or disproportionate to do so. Where they are provided in both Welsh and English they must be provided in such a way as to not treat the Welsh language less favourably than English, in accordance with the Welsh Language (Wales) Measure 2011.

SCHEDULE 1 The Purposes

The purpose of the Funding is to:

- To establish and manage low cost, community based e-bike hire and loan pilot schemes for two years in at least four areas with high levels of deprivation in Wales, to promote and gather evidence from participants on e-bike usage; and
- 2. To establish and manage e-cargo bike 'library' pilot schemes in at least two urban location for two years in Wales, inviting local businesses and individuals to engage in trialling different e-cargo bike models to promote and gather evidence on e-cargo bike usage
- 3. Enable purchase of at least 80 e-bikes and accessories, including See-Sense monitors for each bike
- 4. Enable purchase of at least 16 e-cargo bikes and accessories
- 5. Enable provision of appropriate project management, reporting community engagement, marketing and promotion, technical support, monitoring and evaluation, equipment provision, storage and maintenance and any other services as required to deliver the above.

Further detail on requirements for each pilot scheme is set out below:

Requirements for scheme 1) – Low cost, community based e-bike hire and loan pilot schemes

- a) To establish at least four schemes with one in each of the Welsh Region (North, Mid, South East and South West)
- b) To establish one scheme in Townhill, Swansea.
- c) To select remaining locations using the index of multiple deprivation and by topography (to select hilly area) and to select locations which capture greatest demographic and geographical (e.g. urban, rural etc) variation whilst adhering to the two aforementioned criteria.
- d) To develop a loan and hire framework which offers low cost hire and longer term loan of e-bikes for residents living in the communities in where schemes are based.
- e) To use partnerships with registered community enterprises to ensure long term sustainability and minimise staff cost wherever possible
- f) To facilitate relocation of schemes, after a minimum period at one location of one year, if schemes are not achieving sufficient utilisation of e-bikes or e-cargo bikes as determined by the Welsh Government.

- g) To develop recommendations for WG e-bike policy and programmes on the basis of the pilot schemes outcomes.
- h) To develop and present a monitoring and evaluation plan for review and agreement by Welsh Government. Monitoring and evaluation should include the following evidence:

Quantitative

- 1. Demographic profile of those people taking up loan / hire of e-bike (including gender, age, and income or employment status
- 2. Data on length of hire and loan periods, trip numbers, trip purposes, trip lengths, route taken and elevation change
- 3. Travel mode share from users (including car use, public transport, walking, conventional cycling etc) prior to participation in scheme
- 4. Travel mode share from users (including car use, public transport, walking, conventional cycling etc) during participation in scheme, to specifically bring out:
 - a. Proportion of e-bike trips/distance that would otherwise have been made by walk / conventional bike / car as driver / car as passenger / public transport / other / not travelled
 - Distance/trip numbers made by any active mode of travel while loaned / hiring the e-bike, compared to before the loan and/or afterwards
 - c. Distance/trip numbers made by car while loaned / hiring the e-bike, compared to before the loan and/or afterwards
- 5. Differences in effect on travel behaviour between rural and urban areas
- 6. An estimate of the average carbon saving per person / loan, again distinguishing between impacts in rural and urban areas

Qualitative

- 7. Qualitative data from users on how participation in schemes has impacted them; in particular their health and well-being and whether it enabled trips they would otherwise not have been able to make,
- 8. Impact of participation on perceptions of cycling and likely future behaviour/intentions at the end of loan / hire period (e.g. will / will not buy an e-bike; what further incentive would be needed for users to buy an e-bikes); some of these should be compiled in user stories
- 9. Perceived barriers to using the e-bike more

- f) To develop and present a monitoring and evaluation plan for review and agreement by Welsh Government. Monitoring and evaluation should include the following evidence:

Quantitative

- Data from users to understand trip numbers, trip lengths, trip purposes. To include quantification of car or van mileage replaced by e-cargo bike use
- 2. Analysis of resultant carbon savings
- 3. Seen/predicted financial impact on businesses as a result ecargo bike usage

Qualitative

- 4. Qualitative information on the range of uses of e-cargo-bikes i) by organisations and businesses e.g. food delivery / services (plumber, electrician etc.) / small packages / etc.; (ii) by individuals (e.g. family shopping / transporting children etc.
- Qualitative information on the size of organisation or or business is an e-cargo bike library scheme most suitable for? (e.g. micro / SME / other)
- Qualitative information on how geography influences potential for e-cargo bike uptake (e.g. city centre/ inner urban / suburban / rural)
- 7. Data from users to understand how participation in schemes has influenced their perceptions on e-cargo bikes use for businesses and likely future behaviour (e.g. intention to buy an e-cargo bike at end of trial); some compiled as case study examples

- 8. User perceptions of barriers to the adoption of e-cargo bikes, and how these could be overcome
- 9. User perceptions on benefits to their business
