Thank you for your request which I received on 22 November 20024. You asked for:

- During the financial year 2024-25, to date how many residents in Wales have been asked to pay their council tax bill in one lump sum?
- During the financial year 2024-25, to date how many residents in each council have been asked to pay their council tax bill in one lump sum?

Our response

Following a search of our paper and electronic records, I have established that the information you require is not held by the Welsh Government.

The Welsh Government is committed to ensuring the collection of council tax arrears is managed in a fair and sensitive way. We have committed to amending legislation by the end of this Senedd term to help households struggling in arrears by clarifying and improving the steps local authorities can take during the enforcement process. This will ensure we embed best practice in the treatment of households struggling the most, while ensuring those who can afford to contribute do so. A consultation will be publicised in due course and the Welsh Government welcomes your response.

Next steps

If you are dissatisfied with the Welsh Government's handling of your request, you can ask for an internal review within 40 working days of the date of this response.
